### Machinability behavior of human implant materials

### **Abstract**

In this day and age, engineered materials are making significant strides in their application in the biomedical sector. Human implants have piqued the interest of material and metallurgy researchers due to their unique properties. Machining the materials into implants customized for individual patients has been the standard practice nowadays. To contribute further to the same area, the current research work aims to investigate the machinability of T-L107.12 (a titanium-based human implant) using a non-traditional method called wire electrical discharge machining (WEDM). The machinability of the machining process has been evaluated based on the material removal rate using a roughness meter and the atomic force microscope. The further impact of the machining parameters on the output responses was analyzed based on the statistical analysis.

### Introduction

The use of biocompatible metals in medical implants at the time of the Industrial Revolution in the 19<sup>th</sup> century led to a period that saw the beginning aspects of the process of the metal industry [1]. The key element that spurred the rise of the metal implant business was the growing need for surgical treatments to repair broken bones [2]. These operations often include the internal healing of long bone fractures. However, until the aseptic method of Lister's surgery was used in the 1860s, there were so few successes in attempts to implant metal appliances like bone pins and spinal wires composed of gold, silver, or iron [3]. These attempts were met with extremely limited levels of success. Up until recently, there were relatively few obstacles that needed to be overcome in order to implant metal appliances. After that, biocompatible metals led to the development of orthopedic applications that currently play an important role in orthopedic appliances [4-6]. These orthopedic appliances include temporary appliances like bone plates and pins and screws and permanent implants such as overall joint replacement [7]. Meanwhile, biocompatible metals can also be found in orthodontic and dental applications, like dental roots and fillings [8]. This is because these metals can be used without causing any adverse reactions. This is due to the fact that there is no chance of



Welding using a metal inert gas, also known as MIG welding, is an acceptable method for joining stainless steel. The impact of welding parameters on the hardness of the welded connections was investigated in the work that is being presented here. These welding parameters include gas flow rate, current, and voltage. Regarding the data that were acquired through experimentation, the modification was carried out using MINITAB. The design matrix of the trials was figured out by using the design of the experiment (DOE) program Minitab 21.1.0. The number of input parameters that were used was the primary factor in this determination. The Taguchi orthogonal matrix methodology (Taguchi) technique was used to generate some empirical analyses for maximal suitable surface hardness as a function of the aforementioned welding parameters. These analyses were used to make some recommendations for improving the welding process. The typical reaction to the degree of difficulty If there is a variation in the gas flow rate (GFR), it is crystal obvious that level 3 for a gas flow rate of value corresponds to 219 HV<sub>0.3</sub>, which is indicated as the best circumstance for obtaining the optimal value of hardness. At level 1, for the value of current 70 amperes, it results from the value 222 HV<sub>0.3</sub>, which demonstrates the optimal condition for hardness, when a fluctuation of current is considered to be a factor in the calculation. At level 1, for a voltage value of 20 volts, it results in a value of 216 HV<sub>0.3</sub>, which is indicated as the best condition of optimal hardness. This is pointed out as the best condition of optimum hardness.





### ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Punjab Assembly Elections 2022 were a four-cornered contest. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), the Congress, the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD)Badal and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in alliance with Captain Amarinder Singh's Punjab Lok Congress (PLC) were the major contenders. The talk of political change in Punjab was in air and eventually emerged the key factor for majority of the people, as despite having tried both the Congress and the Akalis, their problems remained unaddressed for years. Therefore, what APP asked for was given overwhelmingly. AAP scripted history by winning 92 of the 117 assembly seats with a vote share of 42 percent. The incumbent Congress suffered a severe drubbing securing a vote share of nearly 23 percent while the SAD (Badal) and its erstwhile partner BJP could get vote shares of nearly 18 percent and 7 percent respectively. The incumbent Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi could not save either of his contested seats and over half of his stalwart ministers also lost the electoral battle.

The victory of AAP should not be seen as a chance phenomenon or accidental win. The Congress and the SAD (B)-BJP combine winning elections alternatively, but not delivering on the vital issues led people to desert these two parties. The mismanagement and poor governance along with failure on religious front, rampant flow of drugs, rise in crime and gang wars alongwith unbridled rise in sand and gravel prices left the people disenchanted with the

traditional political parties. This election to Punjab legislative assembly was imprecedented in a number of ways. Two main political contenders i.e. the Congress and the AAP declared their CM faces before the elections while the SAD and the BJP remained silent on this issue. The Dalit politics has been an integral part of the Punjab politics but in this election it gained momentum and currency. The Dalit card was used by political parties in this election like never before as Punjab has the highest percentage of Dalit population at nearly 32 percent as per Census 2011 (recent estimates putting at around 35 percent).

There was intense competition among parties in terms of announcements of political sops offered to the Punjab electorates. The freebies included free power units, cash for women, free cylinders, increased social security pensions, hiked amount for Shagun scheme, among others. Both the SAD-BJP combine and the Congress failed to curb drug menace and deliver justice in sacrilege cases and Kotkapura-Behbal Kalan incidents. The gangster groups raised their heads that led to daylight killings and other crimes. The corruption remained on high tide impacting routine governance and impacting common masses particularly poor ones. The health services were in dismal state as exposed during Covid-19 time. This time these issues worked heavily on the minds of electorates.

The Punjab assembly elections which unfolded many new things need scrutiny to know where politics of the state is heading to. In this backdrop, the proposed seminar plans to hold discussions on the issues of political leadership, caste, identity and issues of governance. The seminar will deliberate the party system in Punjab and new trends and political defections and splits that have emerged in the form of birth of new political parties and coalitions. The seminar would probe the question of Dalit politics in the state and compulsion of parties to announce CM or Deputy CM posts for the Dalit community. It will also try to analyse the issues of governance which got highlighted during the elections and issues that were avoided by political parties in their election manifestos and poll campaigns along with reasons for doing so. The seminar will endeavour to compare the vision of political parties offered through their poll manifestos and election campaign. The seminar will discuss rationale behind announcing freebies as also the fiscal sustainability of the state. The seminar will analyse the gap between popular demands and political announcements to see that manifestos and announcements of leaders are in conformity with the popular requirements.

Following are the tentative sub-themes to be taken in up in the deliberations of the seminar:

- 1. Party system in Punjab and their changing support base.



### Gray Level Co-occurrence Matrix with Binary Robust Invariant Scalable Keypoints for Detecting Copy Move Forgeries

Abstract-With advancement in technology, especially in imaging field, digital image forgery has increased a lot nowadays. In order to counter this problem, many forgery detection techniques have been developed from time to time. For rapid and accurate detection of forged image, a novel hybrid technique is used in this research work that implements Gray Level Co-occurrence Matrix (GLCM) along with Binary Robust Invariant Scalable Keypoints (BRISK). GLCM significantly extracts key attributes from an image efficiently which will help to increase the detection accuracy. BRISK is known to be one of the 3 fastest modes of detection which will increase the execution speed of GLCM. BRISK even processes scaled and rotated images. Then the Principal Component Analysis (PCA) algorithm is applied in the final phase of detection will remove any unrequited element from the scene and highlights the concerned forged area.

Common motives include hiding a feature in the image or emphasising certain elements. A copymove fake is simple to produce. Furthermore, as the source area and the target area are both parts of a single image, so characteristics like color intensity [1], lighting, and noise are anticipated to be closely aligned between the manipulated and the original region.

A major tool in digital picture recognition is copymove forgery detection that has emerged as a hot topic of research in recent years as it relates to the reliability and legitimacy of photographs (CMFD). Because the tampered section is reproduced from a single photograph, CMFD's objective is to identify regions that are similar to other regions of the image. Geometric or post-processing procedures are typically performed upon manipulated parts during the tampering process to render the forgery genuine and undetectable. The key piece of evidence in CMFD is the striking resemblance between the manipulated parts and the original zones [2].




Figure 1. Categories of CMFD techniques.

Broadly, the two categories are utilized to carry out operations on the image depending upon the type of a forgery. The categories are shown in Fig. 1 below.

### Abstract

In the last few decades, the application of Wireless Sensor Networks (WSNs) has been increasing drastically in wide range of fields. These WSN networks comprise of small sensor nodes that have limited battery capacity and cannot be replace or recharged. Therefore, it is important to utilize energy of sensor nodes effectively so that network lifespan is prolonged. In this paper, an effective energy efficient protocol is proposed that is based on chaotic maps and Artificial Bee Colony (ABC) optimization algorithm. The major objective of the proposed methodology is to reduce the energy consumption of nodes which automatically enhances network lifespan. To combat this task, initially network is initialized wherein nodes are deployed randomly across the sensing region. Since, selection of CH is one of the important tasks that define network efficiency largely. Therefore, in the proposed work Chaotic bee colony optimization technique is used for selecting CH in the network. The proposed technique analyzes three parameters like residual energy, node density and distance to calculate their fitness value. The node with best fitness value is selected as the CH in that cluster for particular iteration. In addition to this, the concept of relay node is introduced in the proposed model for reducing the burden on CH nodes. This relay node is used as intermediate for passing data from CH to sink node. The performance of proposed approach is analyzed in MATLAB software under different parameters.

### I. INTRODUCTION

Owing to advancements in wireless connectivity, WSNs can be defined as networks that constitutes number of sensing devices which gather data by communicating with each other. These sensing devices are often called as sensor nodes and usually have a processor, storage, battery and transceiver for processing, storing data, power and communication respectively [10]. A typical WSN consists of one or more BS and thousands of small, intelligent, low-

The development of a routing algorithm that uses little energy is essential for extending the life of wireless networks




Figure 1. Basic WSN network

# ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Punjab Assembly Elections 2022 were a four-cornered contest. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), the Congress, the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD)Badal and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in alliance with Captain Amarinder Singh's Punjab Lok Congress (PLC) were the major contenders. The talk of political change in Punjab was in air and eventually emerged the key factor for majority of the people, as despite having tried both the Congress and the Akalis, their problems remained unaddressed for years. Therefore, what APP asked for was given overwhelmingly. AAP scripted history by winning 92 of the 117 assembly seats with a vote share of 42 percent. The incumbent Congress suffered a severe drubbing securing a vote share of nearly 23 percent while the SAD (Badal) and its erstwhile partner BJP could get vote shares of nearly 18 percent and 7 percent respectively. The incumbent Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi could not save either of his contested seats and over half of his stalwart ministers also lost the electoral battle.

The victory of AAP should not be seen as a chance phenomenon or accidental win. The Congress and the SAD (B)-BJP combine winning elections alternatively, but not delivering on the vital issues led people to desert these two parties. The mismanagement and poor governance along with failure on religious front, rampant flow of drugs, rise in crime and gang wars alongwith unbridled rise in sand and gravel prices left the people disenchanted with the

traditional political parties. This election to Punjab legislative assembly was unprecedented in a number of ways. Two main political contenders i.e. the Congress and the AAP declared their CM faces before the elections while the SAD and the BJP remained silent on this issue. The Dalit politics has been an integral part of the Punjab politics but in this election it gained momentum and currency. The Dalit card was used by political parties in this election like never before as Punjab has the highest percentage of Dalit population at nearly 32 percent as per Census 2011 (recent estimates putting at around 35 percent).

There was intense competition among parties in terms of announcements of political sops offered to the Punjab electorates. The freebies included free power units, cash for women, free cylinders, increased social security pensions, hiked amount for Shagun scheme, among others. Both the SAD-BJP combine and the Congress failed to curb drug menace and deliver justice in sacrilege cases and Kotkapura-Behbal Kalan incidents. The gangster groups raised their heads that led to daylight killings and other crimes. The corruption remained on high tide impacting routine governance and impacting common masses particularly poor ones. The health services were in dismal state as exposed during Covid-19 time. This time these issues worked heavily on the minds of electorates.

The Punjab assembly elections which unfolded many new things need scrutiny to know where politics of the state is heading to. In this backdrop, the proposed seminar plans to hold discussions on the issues of political leadership, easte, identity and issues of governance. The seminar will deliberate the party system in Punjab and new trends and political defections and splits that have emerged in the form of birth of new political parties and coalitions. The seminar would probe the question of Dalit politics in the state and compulsion of parties to announce CM or Deputy CM posts for the Dalit community. It will also try to analyse the issues of governance which got highlighted during the elections and issues that were avoided by political parties in their election manifestos and poll campaigns along with reasons for doing so. The seminar will endeavour to compare the vision of political parties offered through their poll manifestos and election campaign. The seminar will discuss rationale behind announcing freebies as also the fiscal sustainability of the state. The seminar will analyse the gap between popular demands and political announcements to see that manifestos and announcements of leaders are in conformity with the popular requirements.

Following are the tentative sub-themes to be taken in up in the deliberations of the seminar:

- Party system in Punjab and their changing support base;
- 2. Comparative account of leadership of the parties.
- The identity issue through the elections and beyond.
