## 1. Preamble

The National Service Scheme (NSS), established in 1969 under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, is a nationwide initiative that encourages students to contribute to nation-building through community service. It promotes a strong campus–community connection and develops the personality of students through voluntary work.

NSS emphasizes student-led activities, enabling volunteers to understand social issues, build civic responsibility, and engage meaningfully with communities. Volunteers work to support the needy, promote dignity, and provide assistance during natural or man-made disasters. Through these experiences, they cultivate empathy, discipline, leadership, and a commitment to public welfare.

## 2. Constitution of NSS

The NSS operates as a structured program with defined objectives, values, and implementation guidelines. At AGC, the **Dean, Student Affairs**, shall constitute the NSS Committee and obtain its approval from the **Principal, AGC**. The constitution of the committee shall be as under:

### Core Committee


**Dean, Student Affairs – Chairperson**

**NSS Programme Officer & Coordinator – Member Secretary**

**All NSS Coordinators (one from each department) – Members**

### Term of the Committee

The term of the Committee shall normally be three years; however, it may be reconstituted or revised in case any member leaves or is unable to continue. Meetings of the NSS Committee shall be held at least twice in each semester, and additional meetings may be scheduled as and when required. Accordingly, the meeting numbers shall be updated based on the total number of meetings conducted.

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#### Objectives:

- To understand the community in which they work;
- To understand themselves in relation to their community;
- To identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem solving process;
- To develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility;
- To utilize their knowledge in finding practical solution to individual and community problems;
- To develop competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities;
- To gain skills in mobilizing community participation;
- To acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude;
- To develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters
- To practice national integration and social harmony.

#### Aims of NSS Programs/Activities

The operational aim of NSS is to integrate the three core components of the program—education, service, and personality development. NSS activities are designed to offer diverse learning experiences that foster a spirit of participation, service, and achievement among volunteers.

The activities focus on making education relevant to real community needs and exposing students to rural and urban situations. They encourage students to plan and execute development projects that create durable community assets and improve the quality of life of economically and socially weaker sections. NSS also promotes collaborative work by involving students, non-students, and local residents in rural development efforts.

Further, the program aims to develop leadership qualities by identifying and nurturing the potential of students and local youth, ensuring their deeper involvement in community initiatives and the maintenance of assets created during camps. It emphasizes the dignity of labour, self-help, and the importance of combining physical work with intellectual growth. NSS inspires youth to contribute actively to national development and foster national integration through cooperative living and group action.
